The colleges of the Northeast Higher Education District (NHED); namely, Hibbing Community College, Itasca Community College, Mesabi Range College, Rainy River Community College, and Vermilion Community College officially became Minnesota North College on May 23, 2022, after receiving their final blessing from both the Higher Learning Commission (the regional accrediting body) and the Minnesota State Board of Trustees this past winter.

So, what has changed? Well, our name and brand for one. We will now get to brand ourselves together as one organization. Our tagline "Head North" serves as a beacon...for those who recreate "up north" and all the headlights we see Friday evening coming up I-35. It's also a slogan for those who are looking to come our way for furthering their education while being able to immerse themselves in natural beauty of our region. Secondly, we are now one regionally accredited comprehensive institution with six campuses serving the vast geography of Northeastern Minnesota. We have one organizational structure that serves all six campuses under the leadership of President Mike Raich (Jodi Pontinen and Jessalyn Sabin will be the Directors of Operations of the Mesabi Range-Virginia and Eveleth campuses respectively while also serving as Financial Aid Director and Dean of Career and Technical Education). Our mission is to be a catalyst for regional prosperity; and, through our merger, it is our hope that students will see increased support and academic opportunity through the pooling of our course catalog, businesses will feel more supported to help meet their workforce shortages through intentional outreach, and our community will deepen its connection with our campuses due to increased capacity and outreach locally from a one-college model. What will continue to be the same? First, and most importantly, all of our campuses will remain open. We will continue to have five athletic programs at our legacy campuses that provide so much opportunity for students from all over the country and internationally as well. We will also continue to have six campus foundations (including one alumni association that also gives out scholarships). Lastly, but certainly not least, what won't change is everyone's commitment to student success.

Now that we are one college with six campuses, our collective work is really just beginning. One of the biggest ways we all can affect student enrollment and student success is by being intentional about eliminating barriers for our students. The biggest barrier for students is a financial barrier, not being able to afford (whether that is transportation costs, childcare costs, food costs, or tuition costs) to make the jump into college. In addition, we hear all too often from businesses and other organizations in our region that there is a critical workforce shortage all throughout our region. Something has to give! So, the question is really, how are we going to make the students' decision to attend college, easier? What are the levers we can pull to make it more attractive? Creating a sustained and aligned culture of philanthropy across Minnesota North College via our campus-based foundations, and being laser-focused on substantially increasing our scholarship awards, while not a silver bullet, is as close to a silver bullet as we will get.

As I mentioned, as we move forward, our college will continue to have and promote our six campus foundations (including two at the Mesabi Range campus in the form of the Alumni Association, and Campus Foundation). Our campus foundations are a vital connection to our local community and will continue to be moving forward. My role, while continually evolving, will be that of a convener, facilitator, and liaison between our college leadership team and our six campus foundations and their staff and boards.

In addition, my role will be to support our foundations directly, when and where it makes sense, and as determined by the campus foundation boards. For instance, in the absence of executive leadership, the Vermilion Campus Foundation Board asked that I serve as their Executive Director to help them reconstitute their board and modernize their activities. To that end, at Vermilion we have hired a new Foundation Coordinator, in Sarah Murn, and together we are starting to move in a positive direction.

There is a lot of potential across all of our campus foundations; and, for the good of the region, I am really hopeful about where we all can go, together! Thank you for your continued commitment to the Mesabi Range campuses and to the future of Minnesota North College. It has never been a better time to "Head North."
