PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Paramedics are trained to provide medical care to people who have suffered from an illness or an injury outside of the hospital setting. Paramedics work under protocols approved by a physician medical director to recognize, assess, and manage medical emergencies and transport patients to definitive medical care. EMTs provide basic life support, and Paramedics provide advanced life support.

Minnesota North College Paramedic students participate in regional disaster drills, joint training sessions with area public safety agencies and get a great learning experience.

Paramedic training is composed of in-classroom, didactic instruction, online assignments; in-hospital clinical practice; and a supervised field internship on an ambulance. Courses typically are competency-based and supported by performance assessments. Instruction provides students with knowledge of acute and critical changes in physiology, psychological and clinical symptoms that they might encounter in an emergency medical situation.

This program begins every third semester: Fall 2023, Spring 2025, Fall 2026, etc.

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PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon completion of the Paramedic program, the graduate will be able to:

- Demonstrate proficiency in Paramedic skill tests, written exams, and simulations.
- Evaluate and apply clinical information relevant to the role of a paramedic.
- Demonstrate effective written and verbal communication skills.
- Demonstrate critical thinking and decision-making skills to assess and treat patients in emergency settings.
- Exhibit professional affective behavior, judgement, and rapport with patients and colleagues.

ACCREDITATION

The Paramedic Program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (www.caahep.org) upon the recommendation of the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions (CoAEMSP).

PROGRAM NOTES

- Courses must be taken in semester order listed above.
- Differential tuition is assessed for the EMTP courses.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Career opportunities for paramedics include private or public ambulance companies, hospitals, community paramedic, industry and city health agencies, fire departments and law enforcement agencies. Park services, ski patrols, and other groups in many countries often educate their personnel to become EMTs or paramedics as part of their duties. This prepares students to write the National Registry Paramedic Exam.
