

# Estimated Expenses

F-1 International Students | 2024-2025 Academic Year

**The below expenses are estimates only and subject to change.** We have divided expenses into two groups: what you will pay the college directly and additional personal expenses you will likely incur traveling to and attending college. As an international applicant, you are required to demonstrate that you and/or your sponsor have adequate financial resources to pay for all of the following expenses.

## What You Will Pay Minnesota North College

*Estimated yearly college-related expenses*

Tuition & Fees	\$6,022	Total for 30 credits per year at the in-person tuition rate of \$200.74 per credit- the same rate Minnesota residents pay. You will pay more or less depending on the number of credits you take per semester. Most students must take an average of 15 credits per semester (30 per year) to complete a program in two years.
Books & Supplies	\$660	This number varies widely by academic program. You may choose to purchase or rent books from Minnesota North College or any other seller.
Housing & Meals	\$7,000	Housing and meal costs vary by campus, room type and meal service options. This figure is an average across all campuses. International students are not required to live on campus.
Health/Medical Insurance*	\$2,300	Most international students are required to purchase the Minnesota State system Health/Medical Insurance through UnitedHealthcare. The annual premium is set at the end of the summer, so the figure here is an estimate. *The only exception is the only exception to this requirement is if your sponsoring government or agency certifies in writing that coverage is in effect under a plan provided by your sponsoring government or agency, per <a href="#">Minnesota State system Board Policy 3.4.1 part 3, subpart B.2.</a>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$15,982</b>	This is the estimated total you will owe the college per year. The Health/Medical Insurance must be paid in full prior to the start of classes; all other charges may be paid in installments each semester by enrolling in the college's payment plan.

## Personal Expenses\*

\*USCIS requires that we include estimates of personal expenses and transportation costs in the total amount students must show proof of funding for. These are not costs you will owe the college.

## TOTAL ANNUAL BUDGET

**\$17,482** – \$15,982 college-related expenses + \$1,500 non-college expenses. International students must show proof of adequate financial resources matching or exceeding this amount.
