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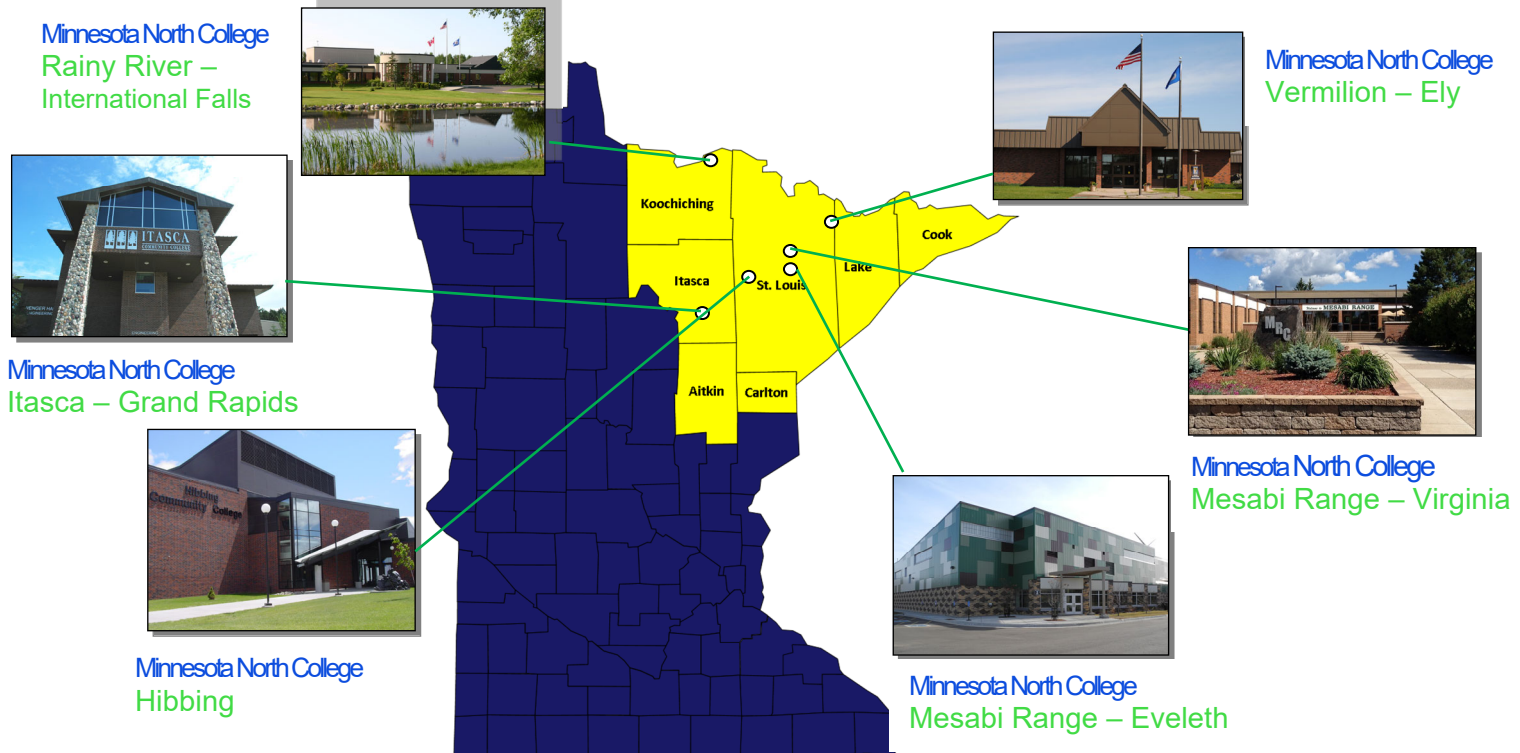
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Fact Book

In May 2022, Minnesota North College was officially unveiled adding another chapter in the history of higher education in Northern Minnesota. Five previously separate colleges came together to form a single accredited college – Minnesota North College. This one college operates between six separate campuses giving students access to numerous classes and programs.

The Minnesota North College Fact Book provides general enrollment and descriptive information about Minnesota North College using data from the college and the pre-merger colleges. The Fact Book is a reference tool that provides a picture of Minnesota North for fiscal year 2026 by using fiscal years 2025 & 2026 (where available) and Fall 2025 data, along with historical trend data. While not all available data has been gathered, the data accurately represents the major areas of the College.

Data may differ from other college and state reports. Such variances result from the source of information used, the date on which the report was generated, or the reporting period included in the data. Trends should be tracked using identical data sources over time.

FYE by Instruction at College Campuses vs. at High Schools to High School Students (Concurrent Enrollment)

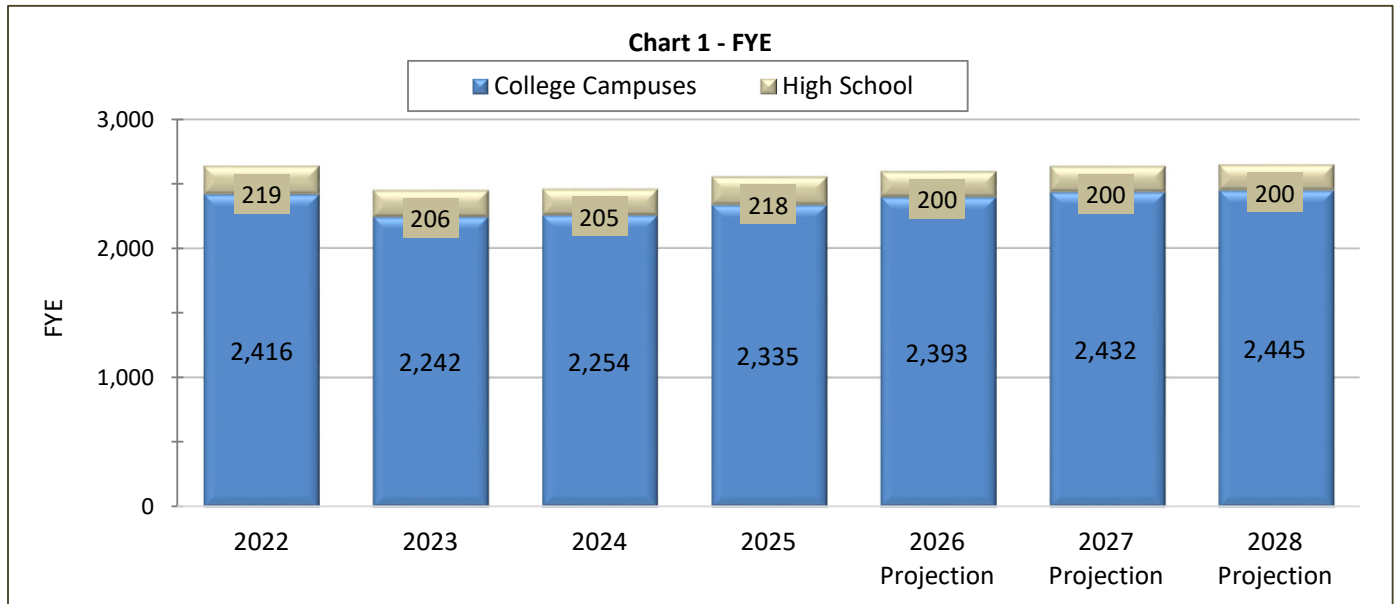

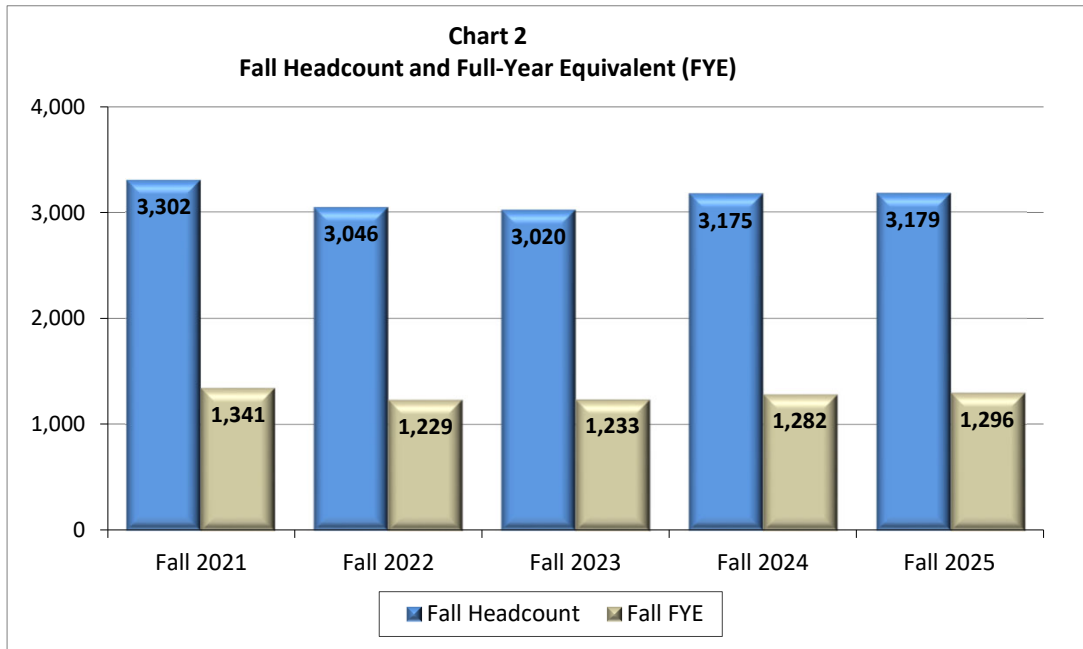

Chart 3 - New and Returning Students

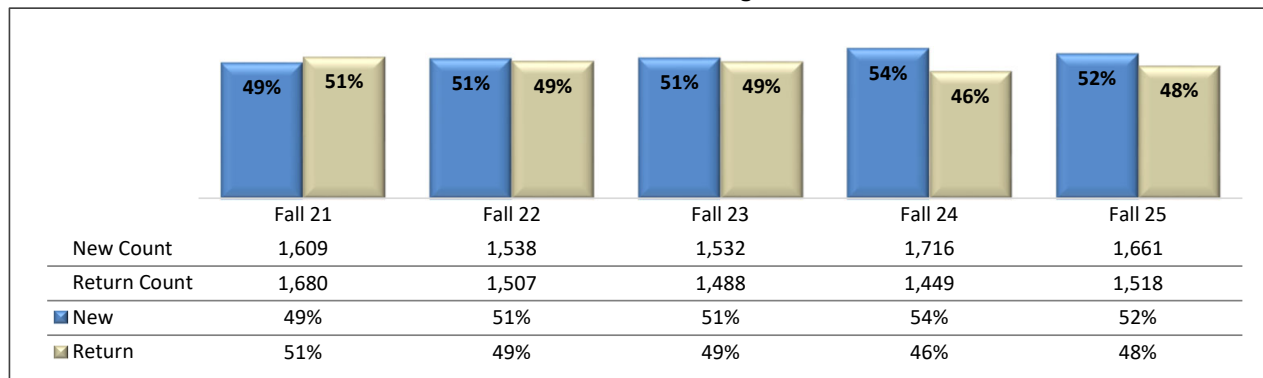


Chart 4 - Students by Full-time (>= 12 credits) and Part-time Status (<12 credits)

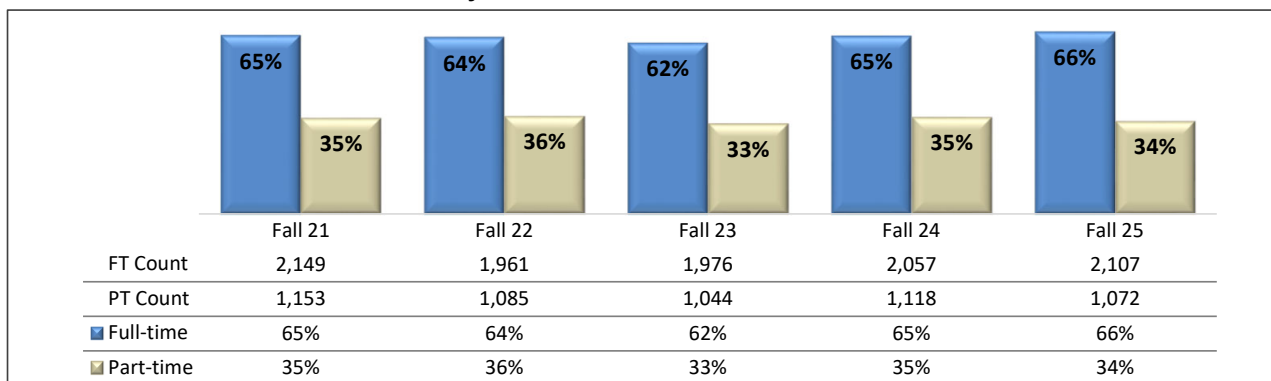


Chart 5 - Students by Admission Status

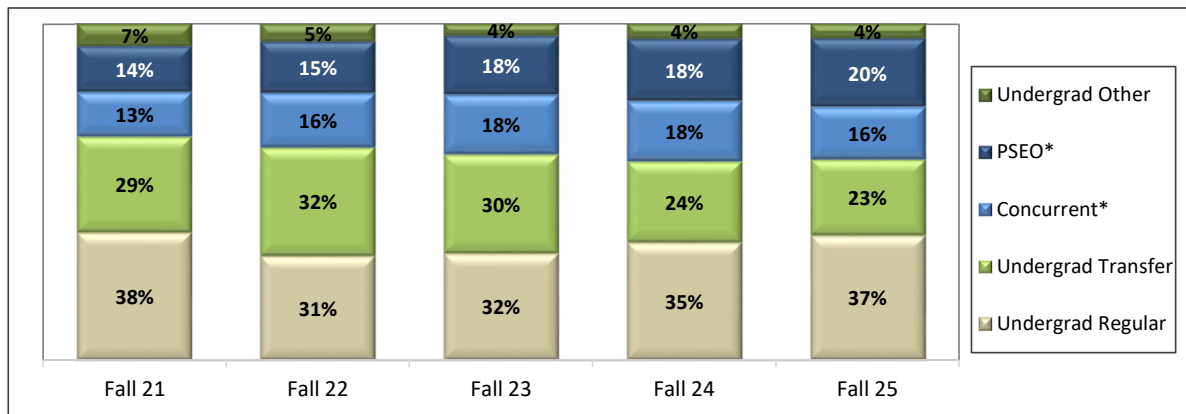

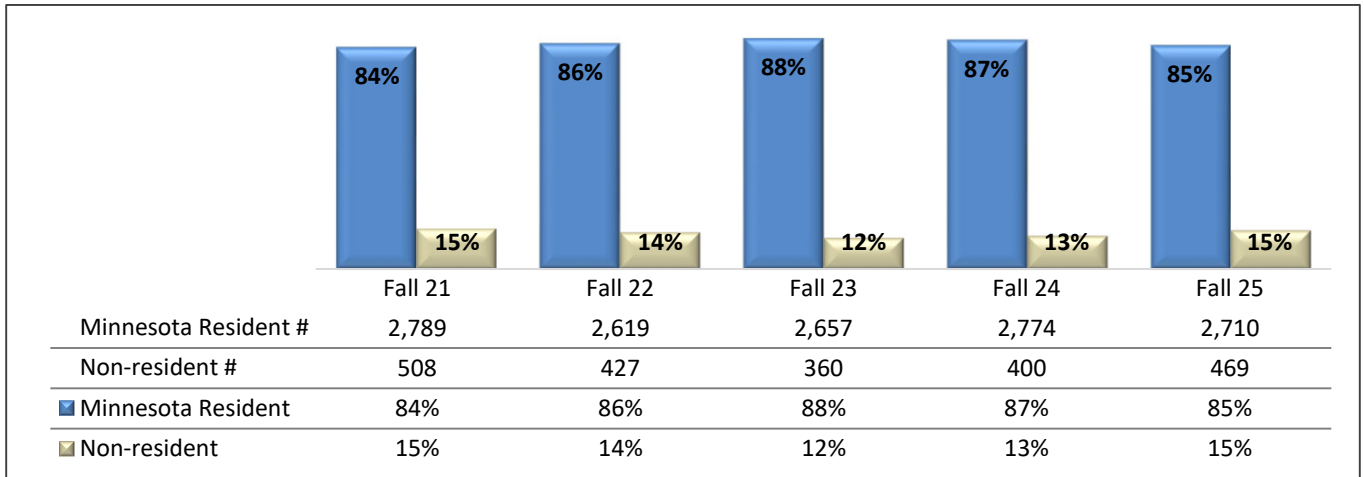

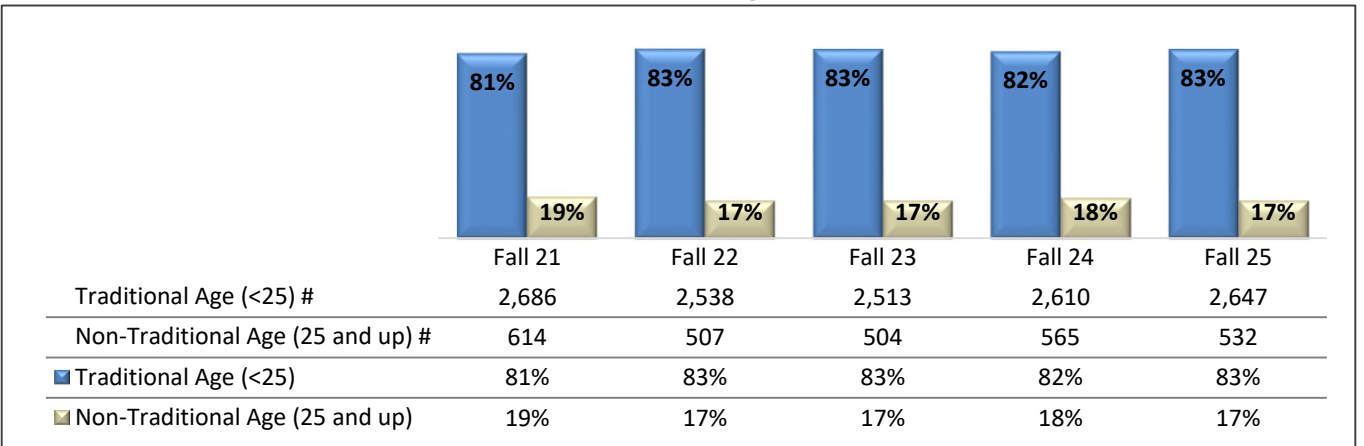
Student Characteristics - Minnesota North College

Chart 6 - Minnesota Resident Status



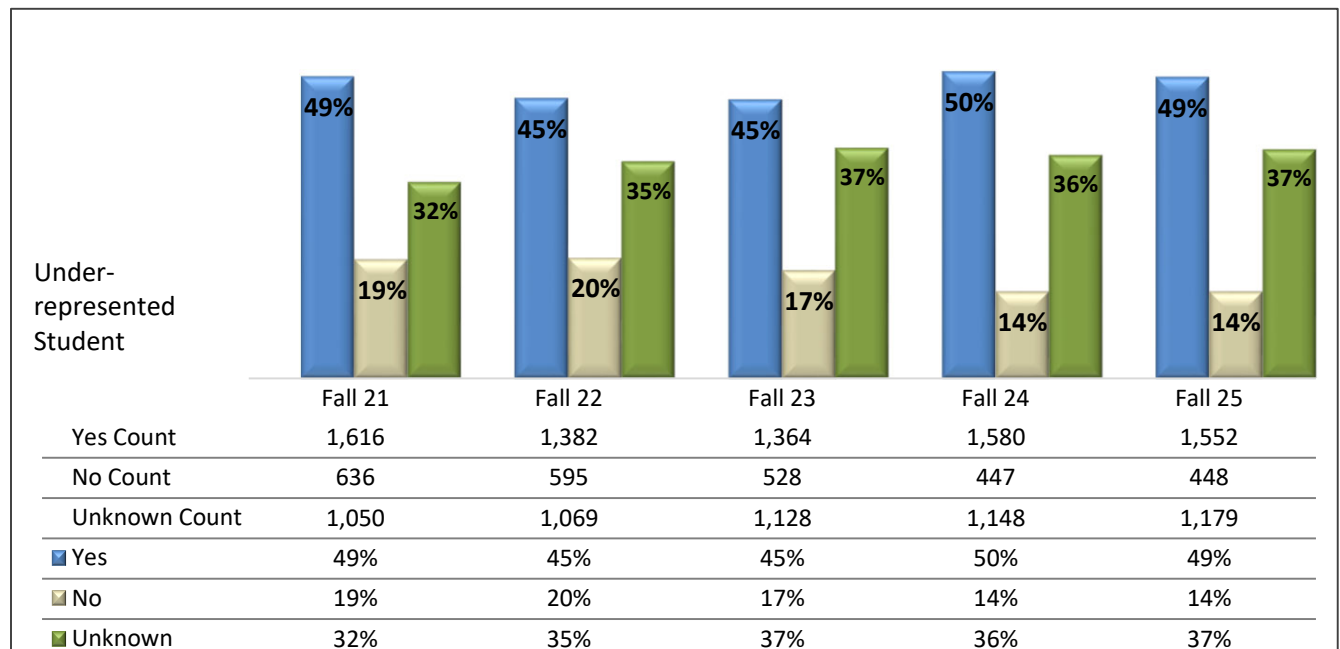

Chart 7 - Traditional Age Students



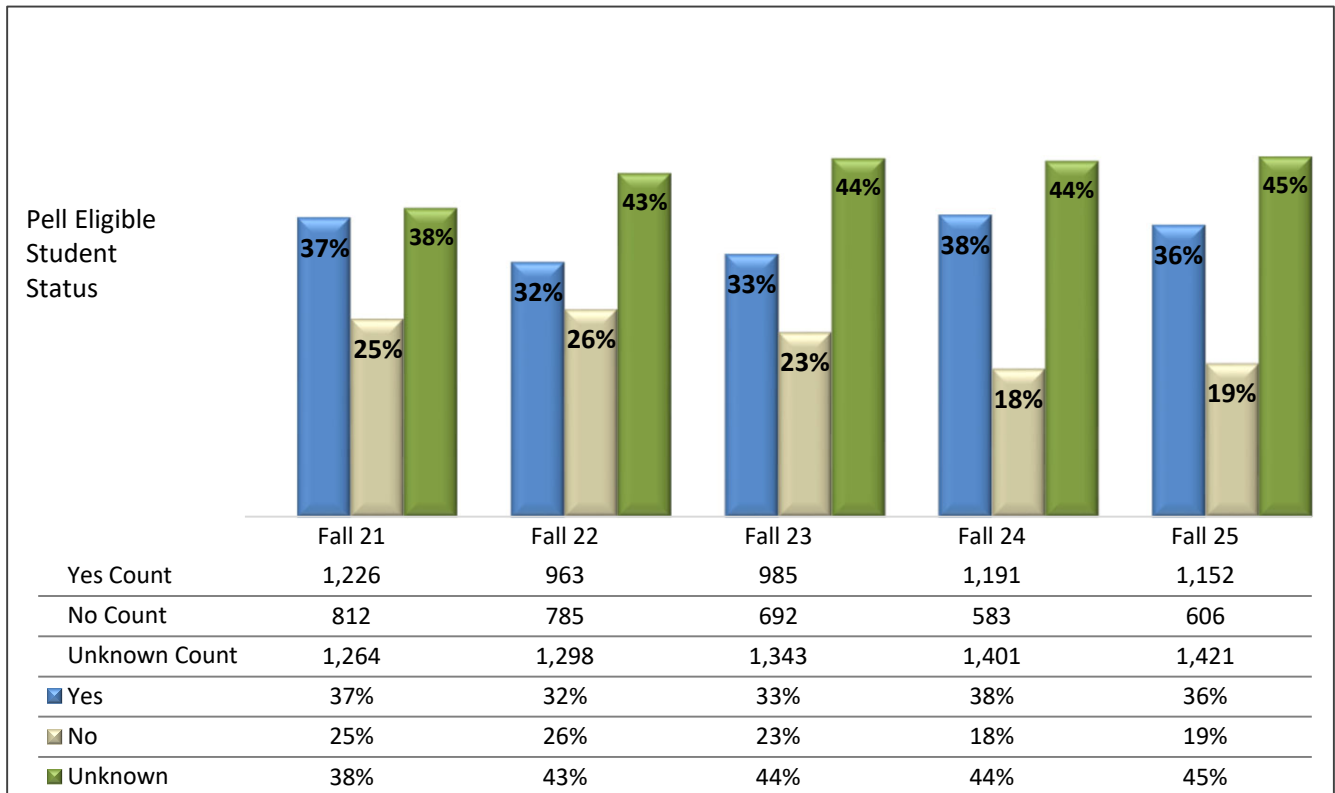

Chart 8 - Underrepresented Students



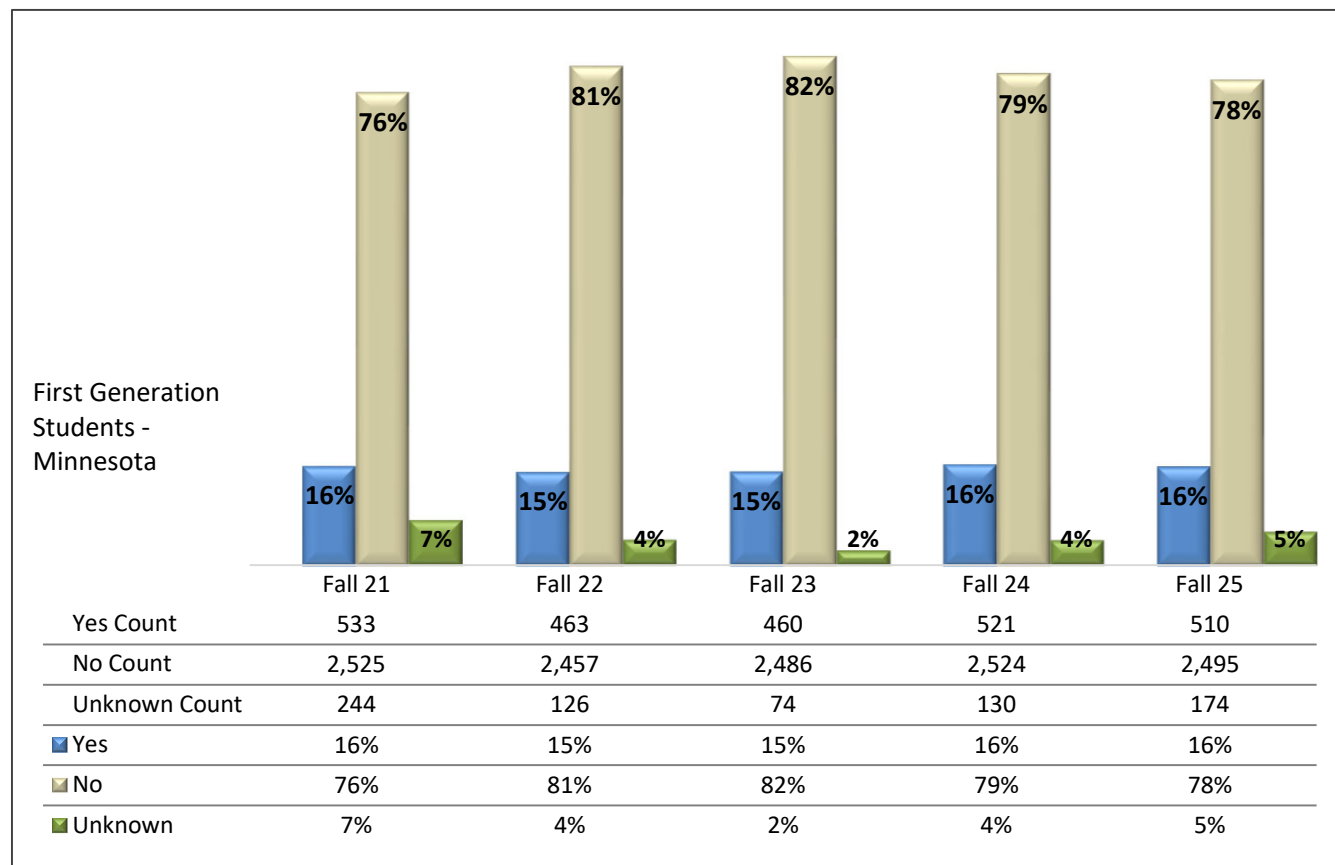
Underrepresented Status - ONE or more attributes: student of color, Pell eligible, or first generation Minnesota

Chart 9 - Pell Eligible Students



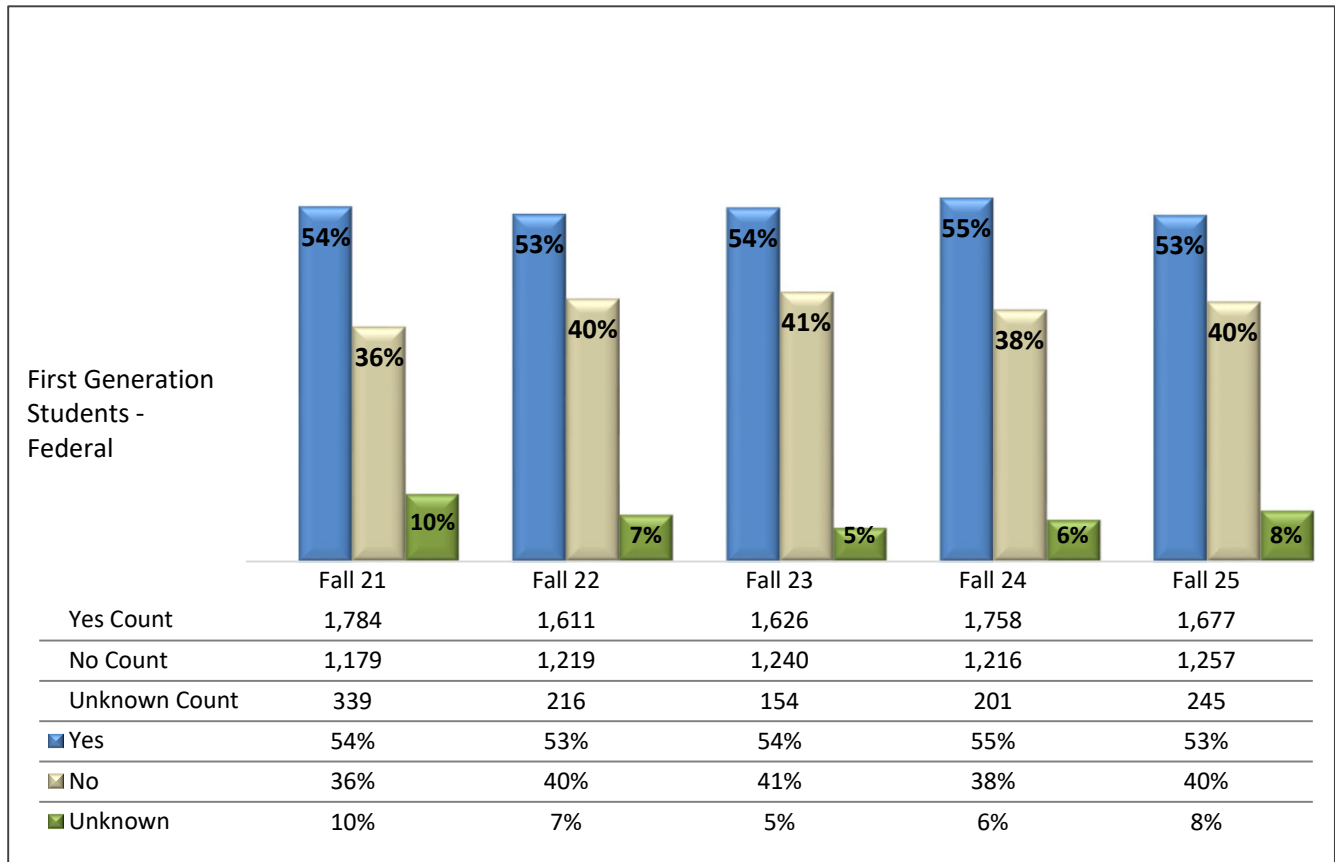

Chart 10 - First Generation Students, Minnesota defined



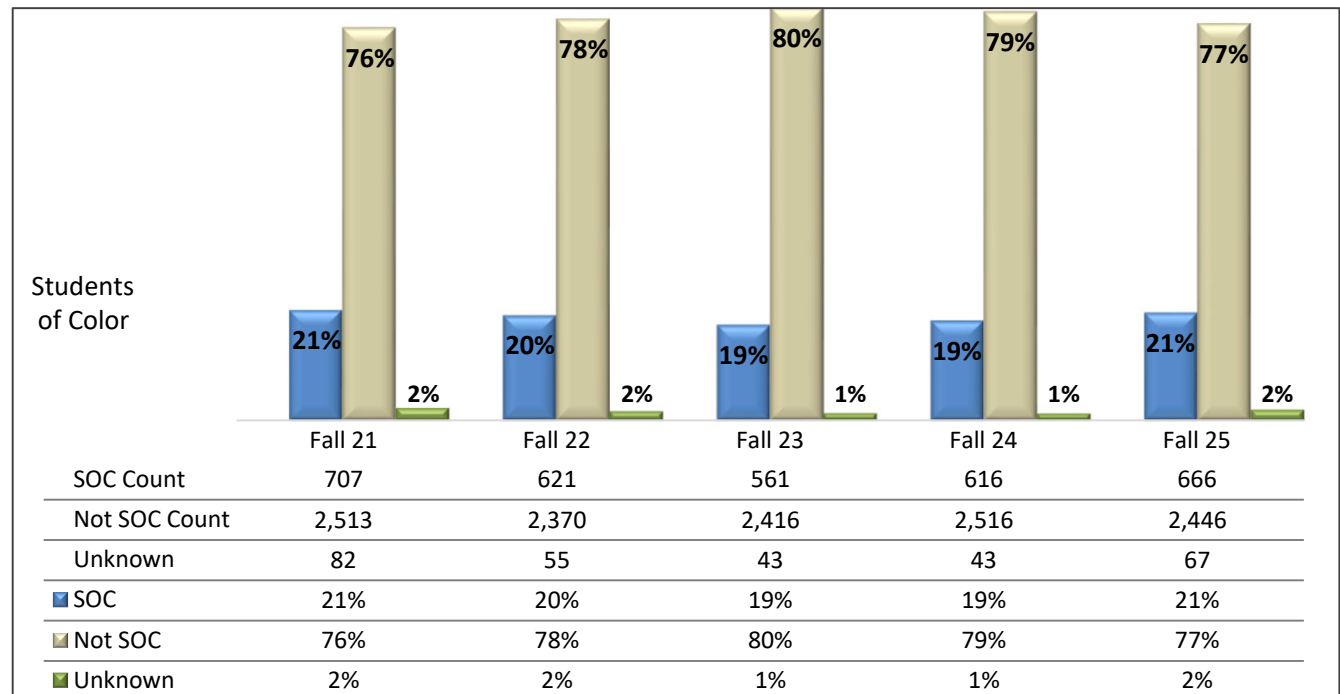
First Generation Minnesota - neither parent received postsecondary education

Percent Students to Employees of Color

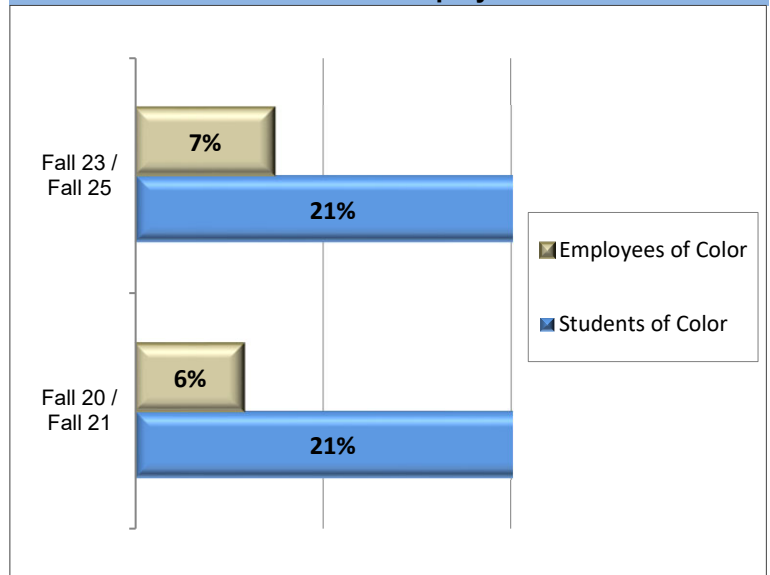

Chart 14 - Minnesota North College - Students by Race/Ethnicity

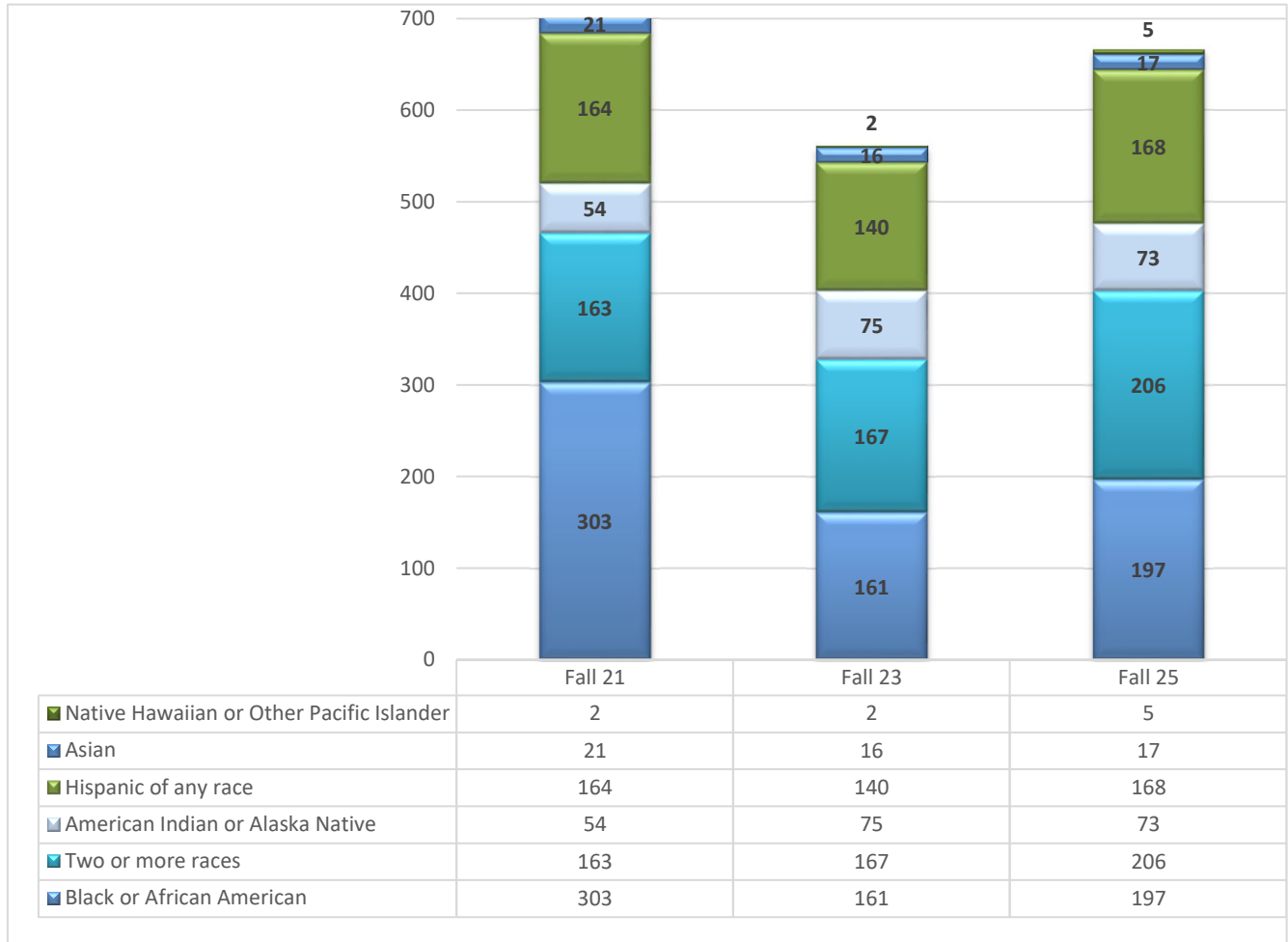

Number of On-line Courses Offered, Student Seats, and FYE**

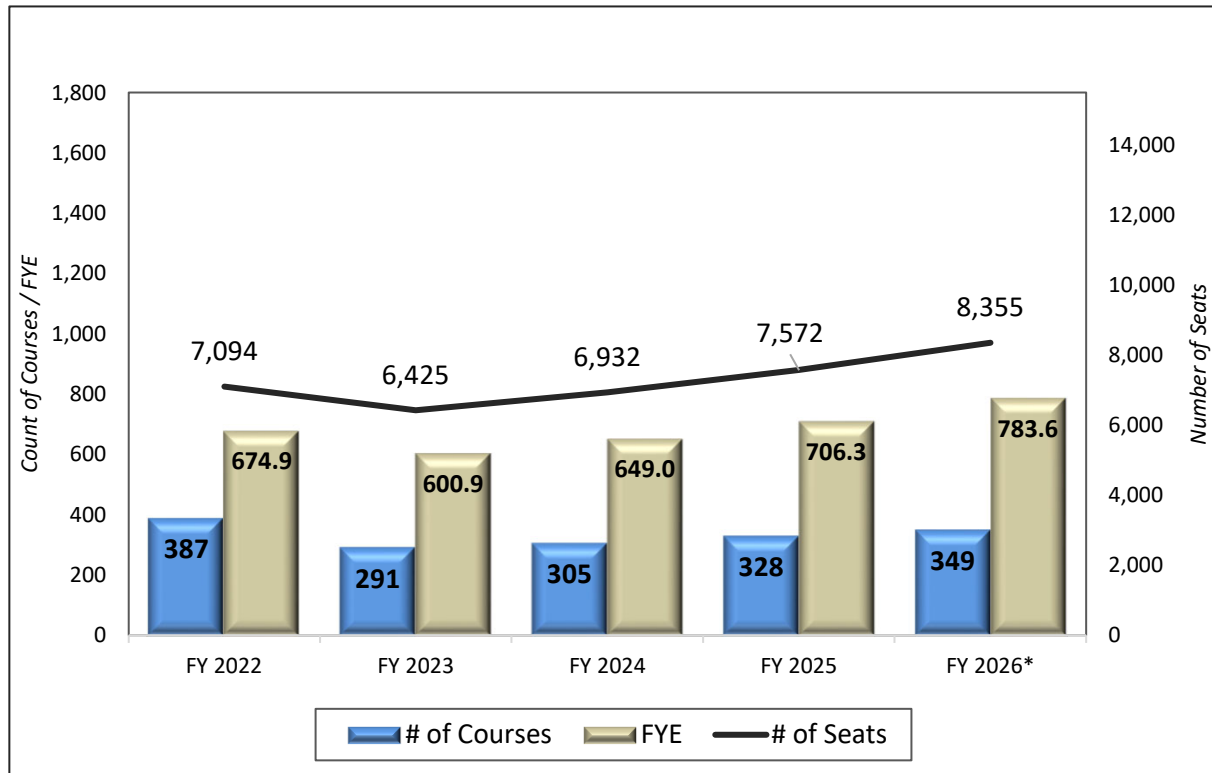

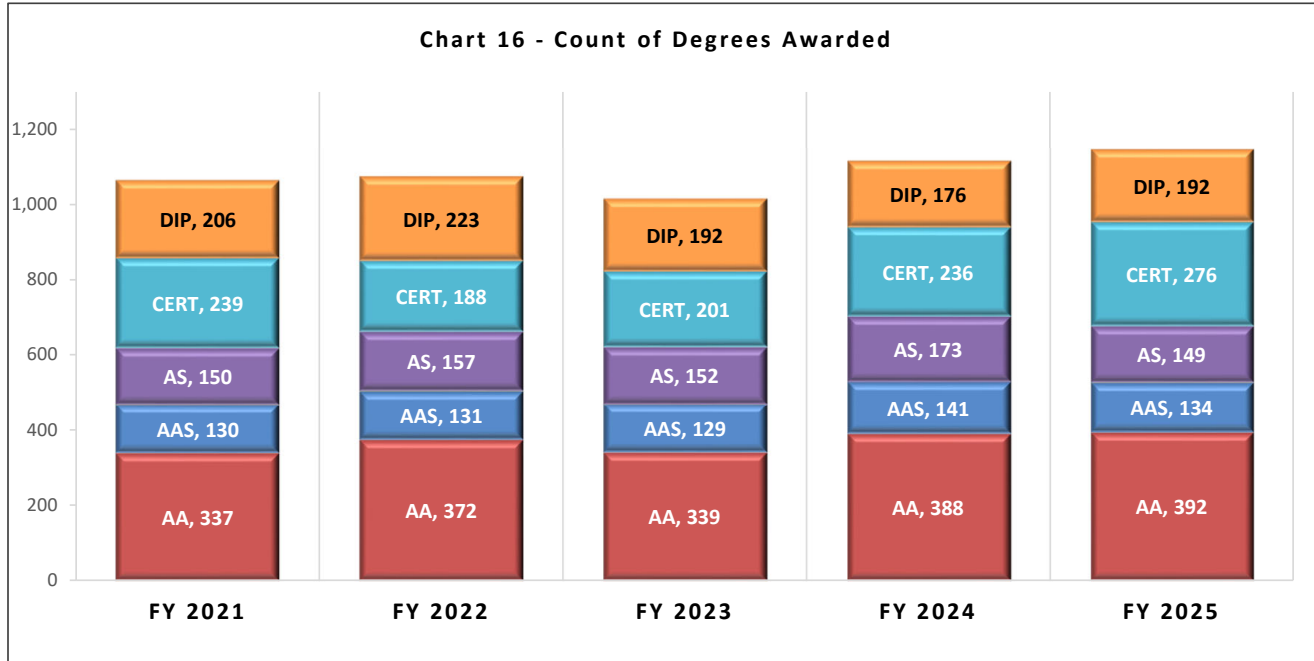

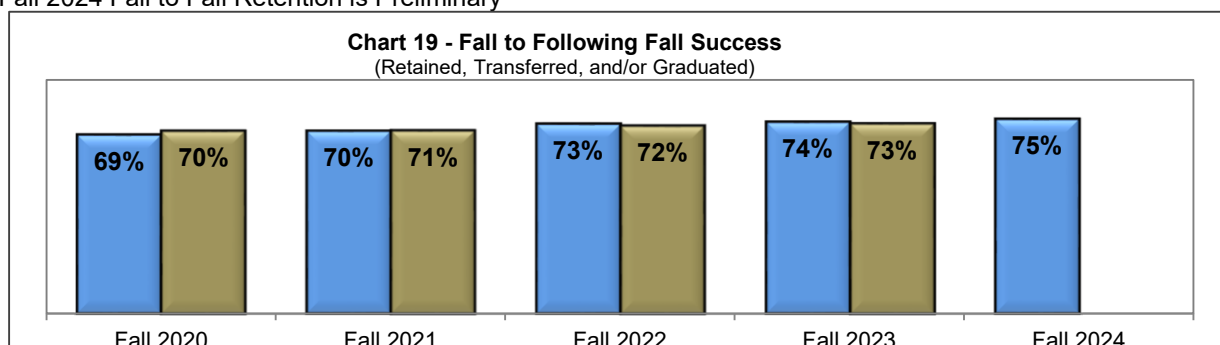

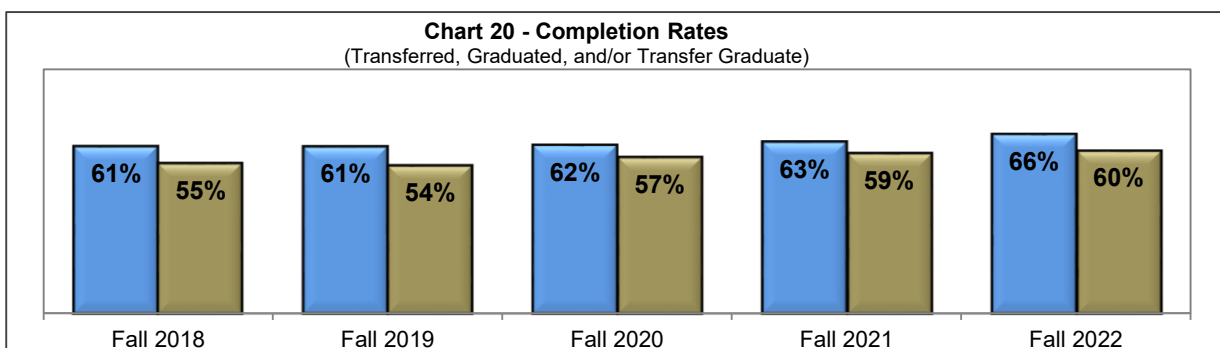
Minnesota North / Pre-merger Colleges Minnesota State 2-Yr Colleges

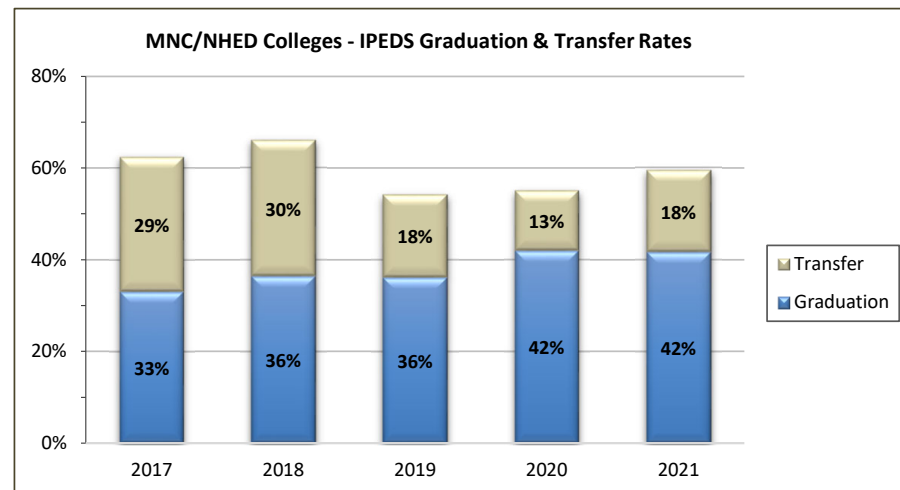
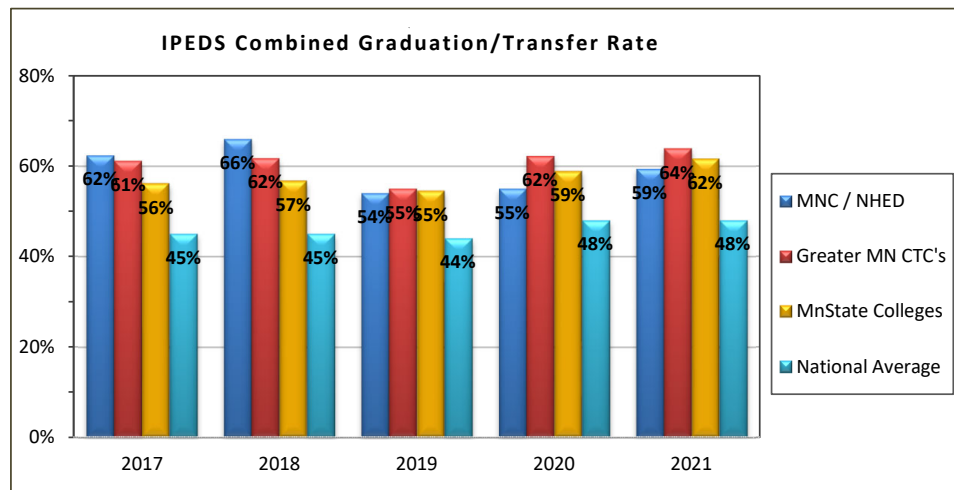

Chart 21 - Related Employment and Continuing Education Rates

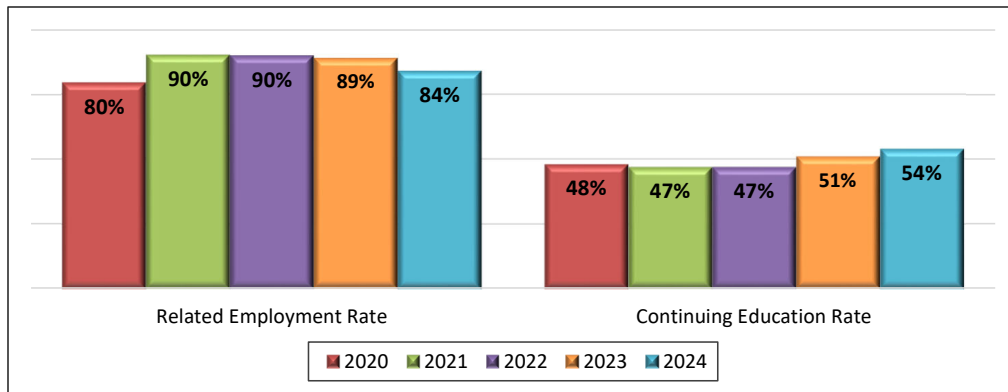

Chart 22 - Student Loan Default Rates

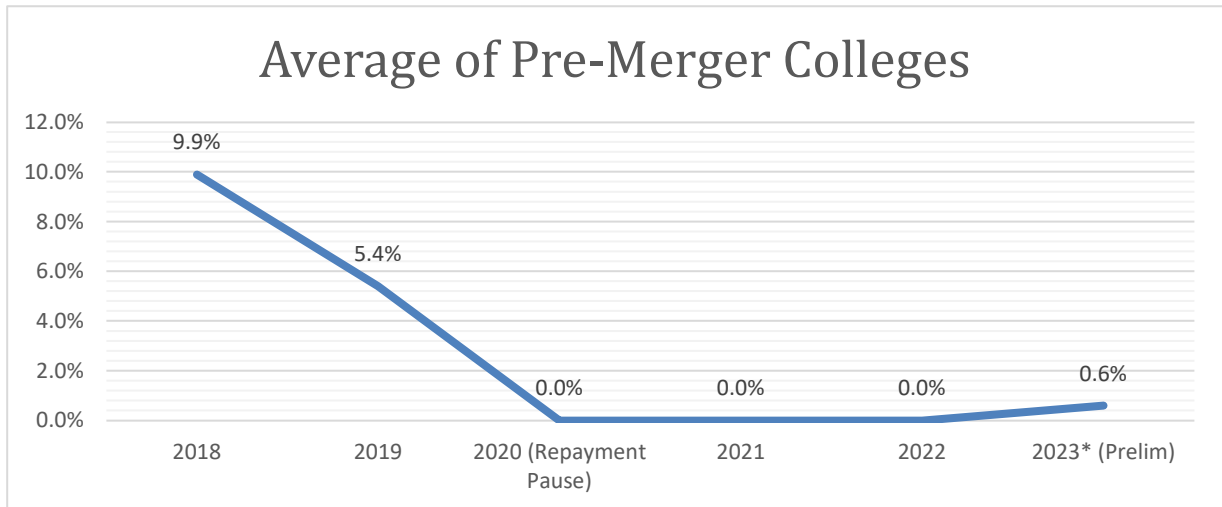

Chart 23 - FY 2020 FTE %

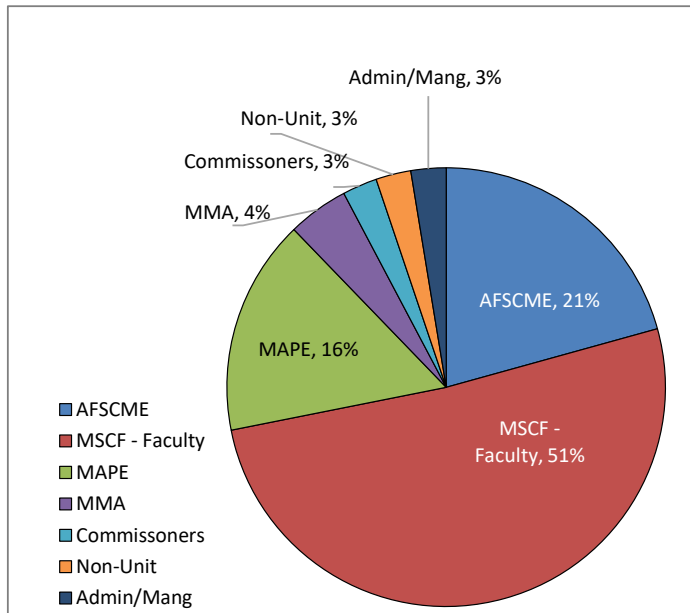


Chart 24 - FY 2024 FTE %

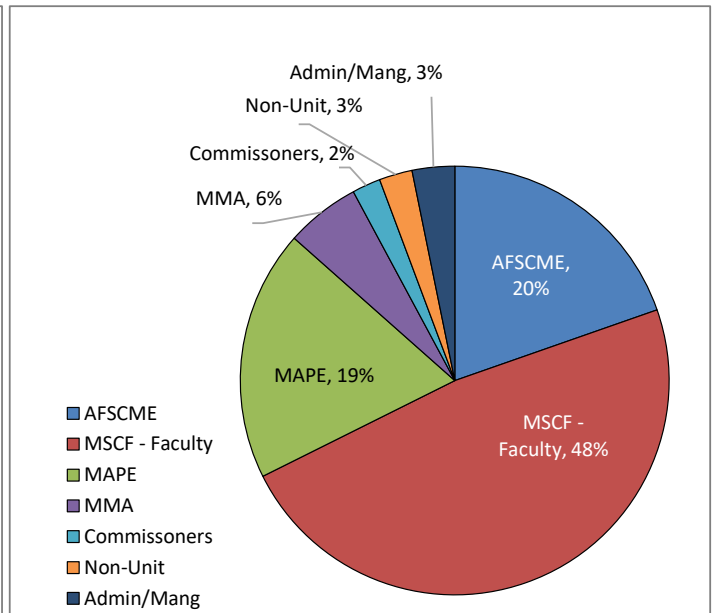

Chart 25 - K-12 Student Counts by Grade

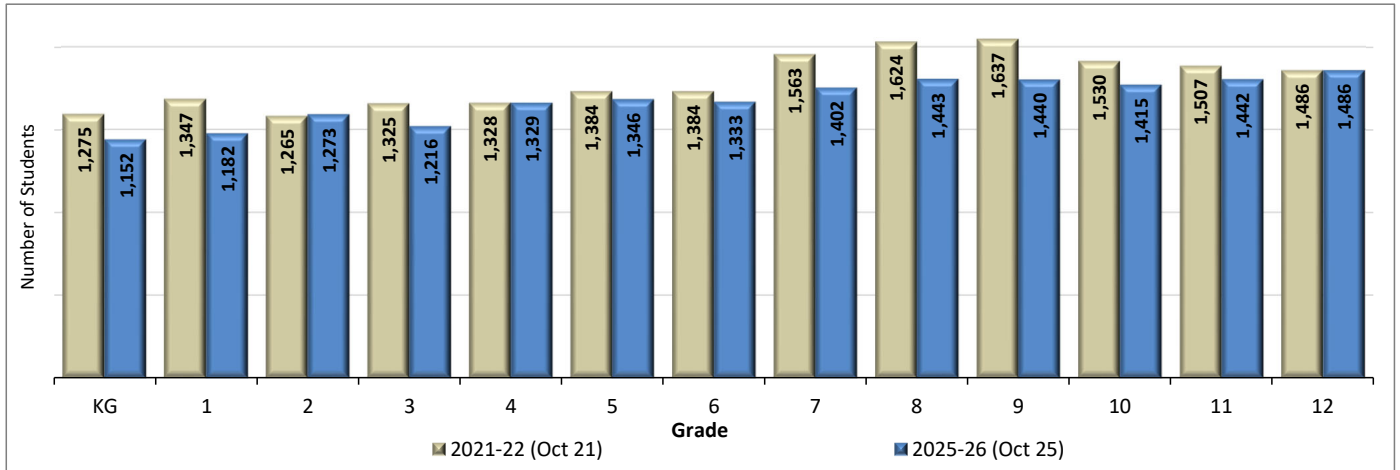

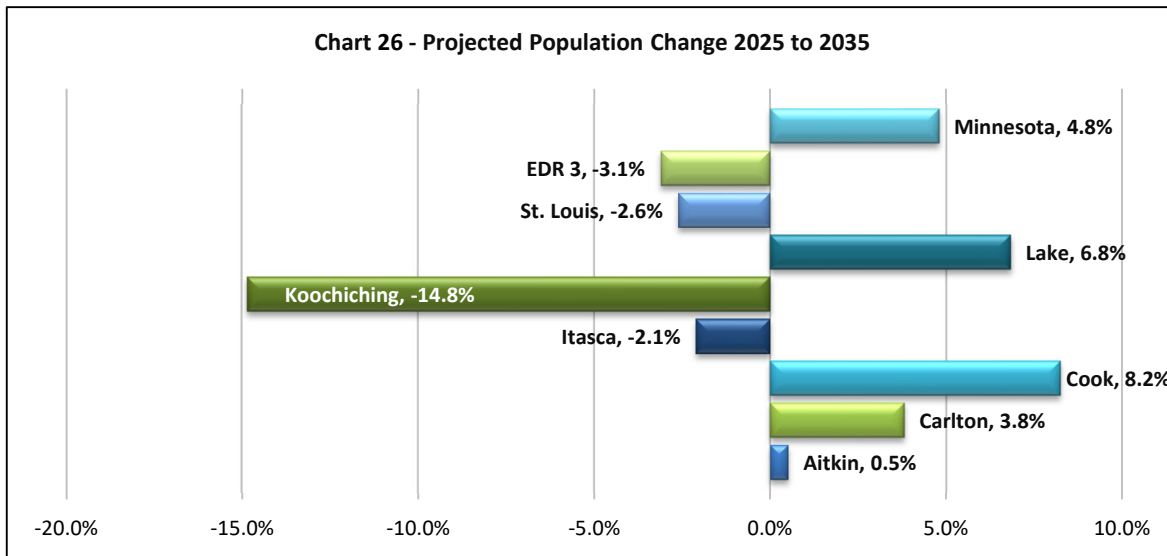

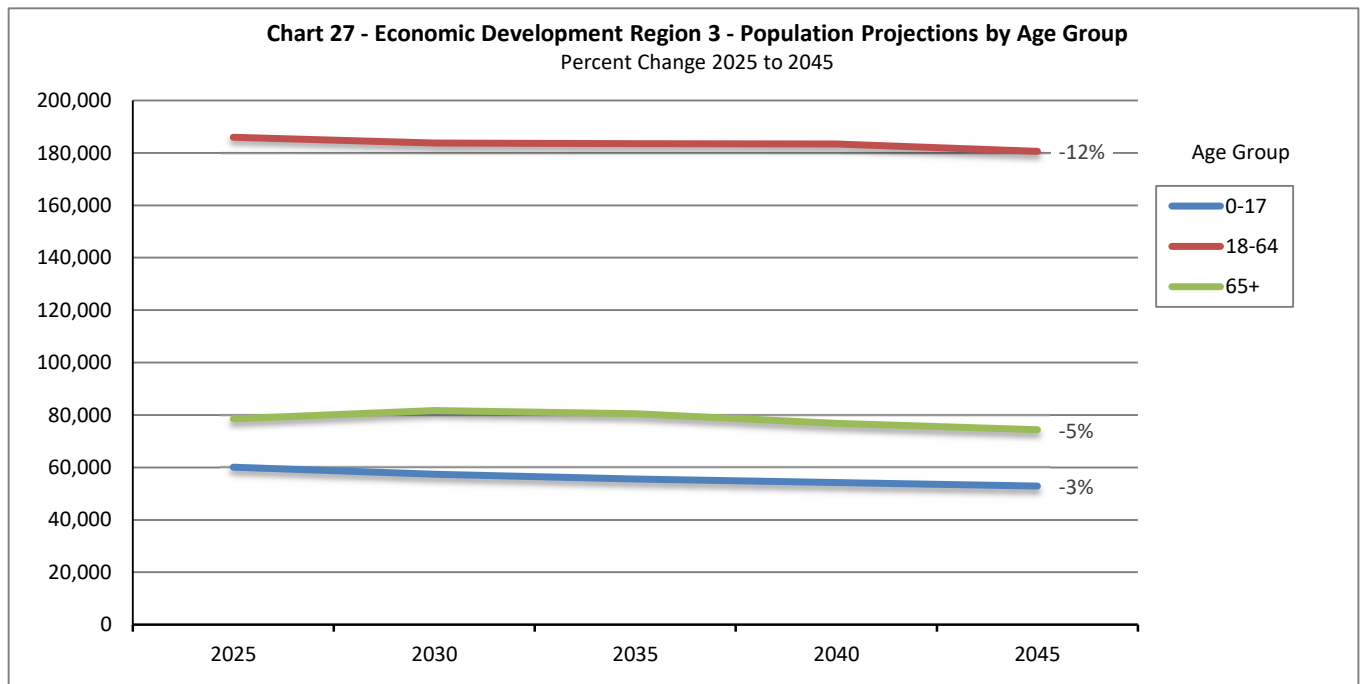


Chart 28 - Economic Development Region 3 - Population Projections by Race

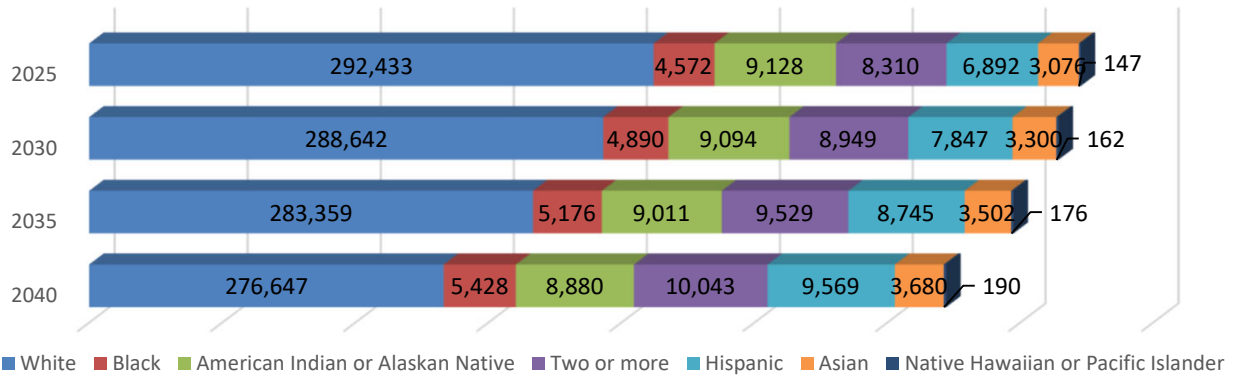

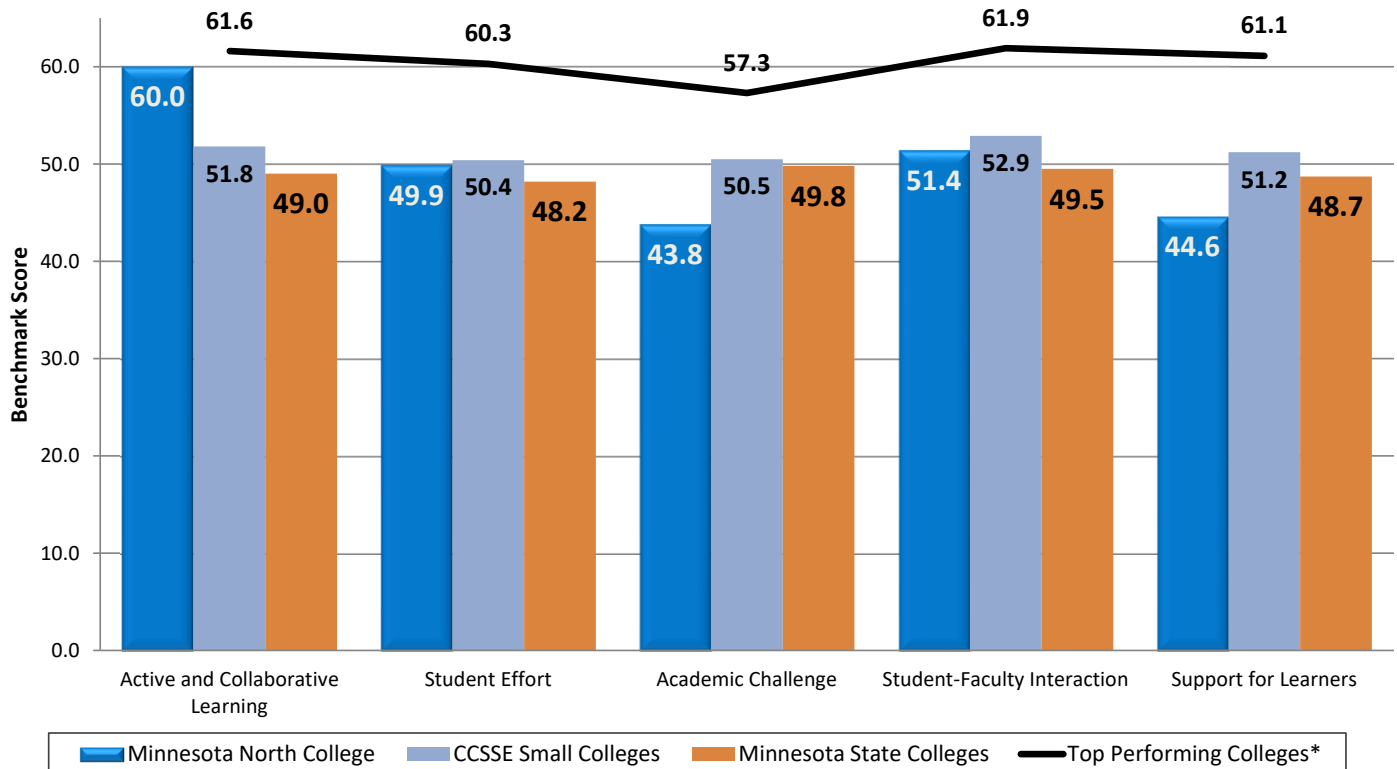
